

What is Adams CWMA?

A Cooperative Weed Management Area is the first line of defense. A Cooperative Weed Management Area, or CWMA, is an area in Idaho where the landowners and land managers come together to work cooperatively to control weeds.

The Adams CWMA takes in all of Adams County. In addition to the [Adams County Weed Department](#) and private landowners, other members of the Adams CWMA include the Adams Soil and Water Conservation District, Payette National Forest, Idaho Power, Idaho Department of Lands, Idaho Transportation Department, and Bureau of Land Management.

Each CWMA has an advisory board that identifies local priorities and guides the activities of the CWMA. The Adams CWMA board meets the second Tuesday of each month at 3:00 p.m. at the Adams County Weed Department, 101 Boise Cascade Avenue in Council, next to the recycling building. The public is always welcome to attend these meetings. If you want to learn more about weed management, this is a great place to start!



What can the Adams CWMA do for you?

- Help you identify the weeds you have and the best options for controlling them.
- Put on a weed tour each summer for county residents who want to learn more about our local weeds and best management practices.
- Conduct community spray days. If you and your neighbors want to pull together to attack your weed problems—which is the most effective way to go! We can come to your neighborhood on a designated day, bring herbicides, spray rigs, helpers, and expertise, and join you in knocking back the invaders.
