Call to Order: Wendy called the meeting to order @ 4:23 PM

Approval of Agenda: Judy moved to approve the July 9, 2025 Agenda

with the addition of Goodrich Creek under Old Business. Charles seconded the motion, and the

board approved.

Approval of Minutes: <u>Judy moved to approve June 11, 2025 Minutes</u>

with corrections. Charles seconded the motion,

and the board approved.

Miscellaneous Business (Non Action):

ISWCC Report: Meghan reported that 21/50 WQPA applications

received funding. Unfortunately, the WQPA project in Adams County ranked 26th overall and didn't receive funding. The board will try to

submit the project as a 319 project. The

commission has decided that more research is required before they move the ISWCC from the Department of Agriculture to the Department of Water Resources (IDWR). They may even hire a 3rd party to make a working group to research the

potential change.

There are new criteria for the Aging Infrastructure grant, and it will cover 50% of the project costs. Reminder that the district survey is due July 31st and the Financial and Match Report is due August 16th. Meghan also reported that match allocations this year may be less for districts.

New Business (Action):

East Fork Ditch: The board members, Meghan Brooksher, and Bill

Lillibridge met earlier today for a meeting and to visit the East Fork Ditch IDWR potential project in the county. Meghan will have the grant proposal ready to submit by August 1st but will need cost

estimates to do so.

Old Business (Non Action):

Goodrich Creek: Ferrel Crossley wants a permit to clean up the

gravel in Goodrich Creek at his property. The district and ISWCC have looked at these issues before and there are no permanent solutions. The board is okay with Bill Lillibridge helping Ferrel Crossley get the engineering and permits needed

to clean out the creek.

Miscellaneous Business (Non Action):

NRCS Report: The National Forest Foundation applied for a RCPP

grant to do forest rework, fuel reduction work, etc. They received the grant of \$15 million, and Adams County is in the priority area. The NRCS will have a new conservationist join in the next

several months.

IASCD Director's Report: N/A

Old Business (Action):

Partners Report: Charlie visited the shared stewardship project

sites in Meadows Valley. It looks like the projects are still a success and should help with fire fuel reduction. Judy was going to check the willows that the district helped plant last fall but there was too much water to see how the willows have

grown. Wendy would like to check on the Riparian Fencing (ASWCD) project that was

completed last year.

No Till Drill Updates: No updates

Well Water Testing: Kris reported to the board a survey she did on well

water testing in the county. There were 18 of 36 well owner responses to the survey. There were eight questions in total. See attached report.

New Business (Action):

Weed Tour: There was a total of 44 attendees at the weed

tour. Travis Youngberg of NRCS was the speaker

for the tour. There was also going to be a

community spray day this Friday. There was one attendee who asked Wendy if the district did soil

testing. As such Wendy asked the board to

possibly consider soil testing program similarly to the well water testing program in the future.

WQPA Projects: Discussed in the ISWCC report

Budget FY25-26: Tabled to next August 2025 meeting

Treasurer's Report (Action):

Main/CWMA Accounts: The main account balance is \$51,631.94 and the

CWMA account balance is \$1,844.92 as of July 9th.

The district just recently received their base funding from the state (\$8,500 in base funding and \$6,000 for operations). The district also received and deposited their city and county annual allocations in June (\$4,500 in total). The

LGIP account balance is \$30,072.43.


